The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of identified pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.

Objective 1: intervention in English and Maths	
Teacher led bespoke intervention according to pupils' needs (based on pupil progress meetings, discussion with class teachers)	HLTA led intervention – 3X a week working with small groups and individual pupils for English and Maths - £2,000 approximately
HLTA led interventions, directed by class teacher	TA led bespoke interventions directed by the class teacher for Maths and English - £5000
TA led interventions, directed by class teacher	
Objective 2: Speech and Language	
ELKLAN Speech and Language	ELKLAN trained TA delivering bespoke speech and language interventions £1000 per year

Objective 3: supporting children's emotional wellbeing

Thrive emotional well being programme

4 Pupil Premium children identified for Thrive intervention (5 other children also identified)
9% of pupils on Thrive programme
Thrive trained practitioner working with individual pupils – approximately £7,000 per annum (£500 per pupil per annum)
